Chief Consults Ex-Presidents

WASHINGTON—As rain dripped on a grief-stricken President Johnson Saturday began to set back in motion a government stunned by the tragic slaying of John F. Kennedy.

For the solemn-faced Johnson it was a day of split-second attention to affairs of state, but the President found time to call on Mrs. Kennedy and to attend with Mrs. Johnson a brief special service at St. John's Episcopal Church.

Continued Progress of Connally Reported

DALLAS (UPI)—Gov. John Connally, D-Tex., recovering from a sniper's bullet after four hours of surgery, has been resting well. A medical bulletin issued Saturday afternoon said in part, "The last X rays of his chest are good. Doctors are pleased with his continuing progress."

There, around a little table in front of the desk he has been using since he moved in as vice president in January, 1961, Johnson was brought up to date on international matters by Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara.
